In 2013

the Library expanded and continued our outreach initiatives to the entire community. We were very pleased to be able to partner with Akron Summit Community Action to establish a collection of juvenile books at Barberton Head Start, dedicated library space in the Decker building, and weekly on-site programming by BPL children's librarians to every student. Another new outreach effort in 2013 was traveling to the Middle School for a new book club group, based on the High School Book Club model which has been ongoing for several years. Early literacy outreach to our younger students wherever they are is a key service goal and we will continue to look for opportunities to expand our reach in this area.

Efforts were ongoing to maintain and improve our building. The most visible change was the renovation of the public restrooms on the main and second floors. There are now larger, accessible, family-friendly facilities on each floor which are both more energy efficient and easier to maintain. I hope you had the opportunity to visit the Library in 2013.
